WHAT DO WE NEED TO DO TOGETHER?

Engage Our Multicultural Community

- Imagine Christ's redemptive work and transformation in Wisconsin
- Meet and interview indigenous and community leaders
- Initiate neighborhood research, including windshield tours and connection with community assets

Plant New Ministries

- Identify the sites for potential new faith communities
- Recruit and train leaders (planters among laity and clergy)
- Draw ministry plans, including financial implications
- Identify partners: congregations, circuits and others
- Create the ministry support team
- Host district level celebration: launch and monitor progress

Launch Turnaround Movement with Vital Congregations

- Envision congregations as discipleship systems (seek, engage, equip, deploy)
- Engage Vital Congregations initiative (worship, new members, small groups, mission and outreach, giving)

- Develop and renew ministry plans with goals and visioning for congregational vitality
- Journey to outward focused ministries and witnesses for the transformation of the world

Imagine Mercy and Justice Ministries in Both Rural and Urban Communities

- Identify and establish mercy and justice ministries in the communities
- Network with local movements
- Join interfaith networks and build solidarity with them
- Establish our churches as community based ministries
- Advocate mercy and justice witness

Create Soul Food in Wisconsin

- Initiate gardening and farming ministry development with the poor
- Partner with local food pantries and shelters
- Engage "green church" movement
- Host migrant workers and become welcoming communities
- Generate a model for stewardship of God's economy in farming communities
